**SUBJECT:** *High School Feedback Report* for 2013 Graduates

Each year, Florida publishes measures to indicate how well high school graduates are prepared for postsecondary education. In support of the State Board of Education's dedication to highest student achievement and a K-20 education performance accountability system, the ***High School Feedback Report for 2013 Graduates***, pursuant to section 1008.37(2), Florida Statutes, is currently available online. The Florida Department of Education's K-20 Education Data Warehouse (EDW) is the reporting source for the 2013 public high school data and feedback data for postsecondary enrollment.

To assist school districts in preparing Florida's high school graduates for successful transition to postsecondary education and the workplace, the *High School Feedback Report* data provide a snapshot of the 2013 high school graduates' academic experience. These reports provide enrollment, participation and performance data to help districts and schools answer the question, "How effectively are we preparing students for success in a postsecondary education program?" Every public high school that had graduates in 2013 has an online report. Within the report format are pre- and post-graduation indicators of college readiness, allowing for comparison of school, district and state data. There are several possible approaches for using the feedback data, all of which can be used to better analyze and plan for improving student learning and achievement. The *High School Feedback Report* allows for viewing, printing and exporting to Excel the following reports:

1. One high school within a district, relative to district and state data;
2. All high schools within a district, relative to district and state data; and
3. All districts for each indicator in the report, relative to state data.

In addition, the "Trends" option allows for viewing and printing data for the last three years (2011-2013) side by side for each school separately within each district.
