## INSTRUCTIONS FOR TITLE I, PART A ALLOCATIONS FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PARTICIPANT FORM

### NON TIERING \*

- (1) Indicate the date survey was made. The last day of the February FTE count is recommended as the date certain; however, any date is acceptable providing the student attendance can be documented.
- (2) List the nonpublic schools attended by eligible students for Title I, Part A Program.
- (3) Indicate, by school, the grade span(s) for children to be counted in item 4.
- (4) Indicate, by school, the number of children from low-income families in eligible attendance areas.
- (5) Indicate, by school, per pupil allocation (PPA). The PPA must be the same as the PPA of the attendance area of the public school the students would have attended.
- (6) Indicate, by school, DOLLARS generated (Multiply Item (4) by Item (5)).
- (7) Indicate, by school, the amount of funds allocated.
- (8) Check one: pooling or not-pooling. If the amount of funds generated by eligible students from each private school is used to serve only students attending that school, there is no pooling. If, on the other hand, the district puts all funds generated by all eligible private school participants in a single account and serves these students based on need with input from the private school officials, the district is using the pooling method.

\*If the per pupil allocation (PPA) is the same for all public schools, there is no tiering.

\* DEFINITION: Tiering refers to differentiation of allocations to eligible schools. See example below.

Example:

<u>Poverty indexes</u>	<u>PPA</u>
100% - 90%	\$500
89% - 80%	\$300
79% - 70%	\$250

**TIERING \***

- (1) Indicate the date survey was made. The last day of the February FTE count is recommended as the date certain; however, any date is acceptable providing the student attendance can be documented.
- (2) List the nonpublic schools attended by eligible students for Title I, Part A Program. If more than two schools, copy the form as needed.
- (3) Enter the grade span only for the school and not for the tiers.
- (4) Indicate, by school, the number of children from low-income families in eligible attendance areas. Give the number of eligible students for each tier.
- (5) Indicate, by school, per pupil allocation (PPA) for each tier.
- (6) Indicate, by school, DOLLARS generated for each tier (Multiply Item (4) by Item (5)).
- (7) Add the amounts for all the tiers and enter the sub-total in the blank space under total dollars generated.
- (8) Indicate, by school, the amount of funds allocated in the blank space under dollars allocated. If the LEA is not pooling funds for allocation based on needs, the total dollars generated must equal the total dollars allocated
- (9) Check one: pooling or not-pooling. Pooling occurs when the LEA put in one account the funds generated by eligible students who attend private schools and distribute the funds based on needs as agreed with respective private school officers.

\*If the per pupil allocation (PPA) is the same for all public schools, there is no tiering.
