Section 1001.20(4)(a), Florida Statutes, requires the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) to annually update Florida's Digital Classrooms Plan, provide the plan to each school district and publish the plan on FDOE's website. The Florida Digital Classrooms Plan is available at <http://www.fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/5658/urlt/0097843-fdoedigitalclassroomsplan.pdf> and was first adopted and published in 2014 outlining specifications for districts across the following component areas:

- Student Performance Outcomes;
- Digital Learning and Infrastructure;
- Professional Development;
- Digital Tools; and
- Online Assessment Support.


This memo serves as the annual update to Florida Digital Classrooms Plan as required in law, providing the plan to school districts and additional pertinent information to support school districts' overall usage of digital tools.

Instructional Continuity Planning

Districts are encouraged to continue to plan, revise and further develop instructional continuity plans (ICP) that prepare for any unforeseen events that may cause a disruption in the educational settings for Florida's students. FDOE developed an Instructional Continuity Framework that consists of ten components outlined below, each of which has a series of development activities. These components will serve as guidance resources for each Florida school district to develop and refine their own ICP going forward.

The graphic below illustrates ten ICP components, each of which falls under one of the four broader categories at the top of the graphic: Academics, Technology, Operations and Communications.

Infrastructure Planning

FDOE utilizes the Technology Resources Inventory (TRI) maintained by the Florida Center for Interactive Media (FCIM) to provide districts and schools with the necessary data to effectively integrate technology into school curricula and instructional strategies. The TRI collects data from K-12 principals and technology coordinators on how technology is used in schools. The results of these inventories are reported online to assist with technology planning and implementation in schools and districts throughout Florida. The Spring 2022 TRI will open to districts and schools on April 1, 2022, and close on April 29, 2022. It is important to submit timely and accurate TRI data this year to help decision-makers and stakeholders make data-driven decisions in supporting our schools.
