

FUNDING WORKSHOPS

The funding purpose of Florida's Title IV, Part B, 21st Century Community Learning Centers program (21st CCLC) is to provide federal funds to establish or expand community learning centers that operate during out-of-school hours and that have three specific purposes:

- To provide opportunities for academic enrichment and tutorial services
- To offer students a broad array of additional services, programs, and activities to reinforce and complement their regular academic program
- To offer families of 21st CCLC students opportunities for literacy and related educational development

The Funding Workshops will provide an overview of the 21st CCLC grant opportunity, including requirements and additional information helpful in preparing a 21st CCLC grant
