ESTIMATED AVERAGE SIZE OF AWARDS: \$800. Estimated number of awards is 5,000.

ELIGIBILITY: Accredited K-12 public, private or charter school in the United States that upholds a 501(c)(3) or 509(a)(1) tax-exempt status.
