Participants will have the opportunity to discuss current issues and plan for long-term system improvements to more effectively address the critical health issues facing schools today, in particular the use of technology in health education.

The symposium will be presented February 5-6, 2004, in Safety Harbor, Florida (near Clearwater and the Tampa Airport). Symposium registration information and a tentative agenda are enclosed. The findings of this symposium will be documented and published.

Districts are asked to send a team of four to six members, including personnel representing various roles:

- Elementary, middle school, and/or high school teachers (including health instructors and physical education instructors);
- Elementary, middle school, and/or high school nurse and/or health care providers;
- Elementary, middle school, and/or high school administrators;
- Elementary, middle school, and/or high school guidance counselors, school psychologists, and/or social workers;
- District supervisors and coordinators of health, physical education, nutrition, and student support services; and
- District administrators and staff development supervisors or staff.

Participation is supported through the Florida Department of Education (DOE) Coordinated School Health Program. Participants will be responsible for making individual hotel reservations no later than Wednesday, January 14, 2004, directly with the hotel at (727) 726-1161. Conference rate is \$93.00 per night, single or double, with a \$10.00 charge per extra person. The DOE, through the cooperative agreement with Florida Atlantic University (FAU), will reimburse lodging and per diem costs for participants who travel more than 50 miles to the symposium. Each participant is asked to make every effort to share a double occupancy sleeping room with a team member. Travel costs to Safety Harbor will be the responsibility of each participating agency.
