### MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT:** Progress on e-Personal Education Planner (ePEP) use at FACTS.org

Attached is the ePEP Usage Report as of February 28, 2006, organized alphabetically by district. Please take a look at the percentage of students who are using the ePEP in your district's high schools.

We appreciate your efforts to encourage ePEP use and your help in reaching our goal of 100% of Florida high school students completing a plan. The ePEP online planner is an integral part of the Governor's A++ Plan for Education and assists districts with meeting the statutory requirements of both Section 1006.02, Florida Statutes (providing information to students and parents on school-to-work transition), and Section 1009.531, Florida Statutes (notifying parents and students about their standing in the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program).

More than 60 district trainings have taken place to date, and both students and counselors are reporting that they find the ePEP easy to use and extremely helpful. To help guidance counselors, students and parents learn how to use ePEP, FACTS.org is hosting a series of six Regional ePEP Training Workshops between March 15 and April 6, 2006.
