Each year more than 1.3 million children are reported missing. Law enforcement, citizens, and even children have been instrumental in keeping children safe and returning them home to their families, communities, and schools. Every year, the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) takes time to commemorate the valiant and unselfish acts of the many organizations and individuals who bring our missing children home. On May 25, 2013, National Missing Children's Day, we will pause to focus our attention on children who have been recovered, as well as the children who are still missing.

Each year DOJ sponsors a national poster contest and announces the winner at the annual National Missing Children's Day ceremony in Washington, DC. The winner of this national contest, along with his or her teacher and parents, are flown to Washington to attend this special ceremony. I invite you to join us in our efforts to educate children across the country about safety issues by giving your 5th grade students an opportunity to participate in this poster contest.

Local schools participating in the event will have the opportunity to submit their winning poster for judging at the state level. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement Missing Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC), along with the Florida Department of Education and other organizations, will be working together to select a winner to represent the State of Florida. The statewide winner will receive an all-expense-paid trip to Tallahassee, Florida, for

Missing Children's Day in September 2013. The winner will also receive a prize package including a trip to Universal Studios, and their poster will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Justice for the national judging.

The theme for the poster contest is "Bring Our Missing Children Home." Submissions must be handcrafted and measure 8 ½ x 14 inches. We suggest that schools start as soon as possible on school-level poster contests and classroom discussions.
